MRRA 2015

Programs and Membership

Base MRRA Membership Fee **

- If Paid by Jan 15
 - \$100 membership fee
 - \$65 for college students
- After Jan 15
 - \$125 membership fee
 - \$65 for college students
- Base membership fee is paid by all club members
- Base fee covers fixed costs of operating the club
- Maintain principles of club membership fees
 Additional fees based upon program and equipment

** Already approved this at December 2014 annual meeting

Summary Sculling Fees No change from 2014

- Rack fees at \$350/year. Due March 15
 - Outdoor rack space (if available) offered at \$150
 - o High Storage (if available), offered at \$50 for season
- Logbook sculling \$250 unlimited use of club sculling boats (and when rigged as 2-)
- Family membership of \$100
 - Same privilege of full paying member
 - Married /domestic couples, children <24, living at same address
- Restricted Logbook sculling: \$100
 - o Row after 9am; no reservations; no offsite racing
- Racing Associate: \$100
 - o Member of another club; rows with a member always

Summer Student - Rules

- ► Full Time Student enrolled at an accredited School or University
- Age 18 24 years
- Rowing Allowed from 1 June through 31 August
- After 8am weekday; 9am weekend
- No reservations for boats
- No off-site racing, unless approved by boat captain
- \$65 Membership Fee
- \$100 restricted logbook sculling or sweep
 - Keep consistency between sculling and sweep
 - No Use of "A" boats
 - If sweep, must go out with OSweep or as a fill-in for MSweep
 - Since is restricted, pay same price as logbook restricted rowing
 - Scullers must pass the boat captains test

Cost: \$10/row - \$40/4 week session (scaled)

Masters Group Sculling

- Objective is to offer camaraderie and fun of rowing with others; Target team boats with rowers rotating in singles based on availability
- Informal group that will meet on Mon, Wed, Fri @ 5:30 AM 7:00 AM
- Starts May
- Initially no coaching if group wants to add, will arrange coaching 1-2 days and group pays for that
- Program Manager: Linas Alinskas
- Cost: \$0 without coaching

Learn To Scull

LTS I/II: each a 6 week program, with 2 sessions/ wk

- LTS I: Mid June after LT Row Day
- LTS II: Late July
- Thurs evening /Sat morn
- Program Fee \$250 each session
- \$50 for MRRA base membership when pass captains test and \$125 for logbook (After Aug 1)

Come Back to Sculling Days

- MRRA pays for 2 coaching sessions
- Welcome back prior year LT scull people (email going 4-5 years past)
- Current members welcome
- Refresher on how to carry boat, puts the oars, row
- Potentially May 30 or 31 and Learn to Row Day June 6

Learn to Sweep – Masters

Need commitment of at least 8 -10 sweep rowers (max 20)

- Two @ 4-week programs, 2 rows/week
- Start mid June
- Mon-Wed evening 6 7:30pm
- Saturday only program 8 rows (try this if enough interest)
- Recommended Fee
- o \$99 for MRRA Members who are already paid sculling
- Non-member \$125 (and bring a friend special friend @ \$99)

Masters Sweep I/II

- 12 weeks each
- 2 rows/wk = 24 sessions:
- Mon-Wed evening
- Start late April/ early May
- Includes coaching; coxing if available; more experienced will try the 4-

Open Sweep Men/Women SEASON

All season for experienced sweep rowers looking to compete at local and national races

- Structure like Logbook Sculling
- \$250 for the season pay up front
- Coach: None
- Coxswain Not paid; gets free base membership
- Row 1-3 times/week depending on sweep boat availability
- Includes off-peak sculling (peak privilege pays + \$250)

- = Total of \$22,000 (if needed)
- Should not use "future" regatta funds just prior year funds



Equipment Committee

- Equipment Sales Recommendation
 - Plan to sell one of the older Singles
 - Estimate \$1,500
 - Based upon final equipment purchase decision

Base Assumptions for Equipment

- 1. Board allocates up to \$22K for equipment purchases for 2015
- 2. Base assumptions
 - No additional dock space on the launch dock
 - No additional space inside or outside boathouse
 - Accomac 4X can go on trailer outside
 - UML waiting for new coach to be hired before making any decisions on launches, outside space
 - Expect this person to be hired over the summer
